JANUARY 16 • MAN ON WIRE

On August 7th 1974, a young Frenchman named Philippe Petit stepped out on a wire illegally rigged between New York's twin towers, then the world's tallest buildings. After nearly an hour dancing on the wire, he was arrested, taken for psychological evaluation, and brought to jail before he was finally released. This dazzling documentary presents rare and fascinating footage of the actual event alongside flawless reenactments and modern-day interviews with the participants. (UK 2008, 102mins., PG-13, Dir. James Marsh)

JANUARY 23 • THE DUCHESS

Georgiana achieves an impressive level of fame as Britons follow both her clothing style and her political advice. But even celebrity and wealth can't act as a salve in her marriage to the boorish duke. When he begins to flaunt his affairs, Georgiana is tempted to return to a teenage crush, to the anger of her husband and her mother. This period film focuses on the lack of power possessed by Georgiana and, in fact, all women of her time. (US, 2008, 105mins., PG-13 Dir. Saul Dibb)

JANUARY 30 • FLOW (FOR LOVE OF WATER)

*This film is presented as part of LPCA's Curated Film Series and will Feature a Guest Speaker.

Award-winning documentary investigation into what experts label the most important political and environmental issue of the 21st Century -- The World Water Crisis. Focusing on pollution, human rights, politics, and corruption, filmmaker Salina constructs an exceptionally articulate profile of the precarious relationship uniting human beings and water. While each community's challenges are unique, the message is universal. (US, 2008, 84mins., NR, Dir. Irena Salina)

FEBRUARY 6 • VICKY CRISTINA BARCELONA

Barcelona is the setting for the romantic adventures of Vicky and Cristina, two young Americans on summer holiday. When the girls become enamored with the same painter, unaware that his ex-wife, with whom he has a tempestuous relationship, is about to re-enter the picture, the results can only be described as chaotic. (US, 2008, 96mins., PG-13, Dir. Woody Allen)

FEBRUARY 13 • SURFWISE

*This film is presented as part of LPCA's Curated Film Series and will Feature a Guest Speaker.

A thought-provoking documentary about the legendary and unconventional Paskowitz family. The first family of surfing became famous for its large size, for earning countless trophies, and for its eccentric leader, Dorian "Doc" Paskowitz. Once an admired figure in the medical community, Dorian decided while at the height of his success to leave it all behind, heading for a life on the beach. While traveling the world in search of the next great wave, Dorian met and married Juliette, who shortly began birthing their nine children. Born in quick succession and never placed in school, the kids were raised in the ocean and in an ever-moving camper. Though they seemed unconventional to outsiders, their atypical routine was actually highly controlled by Dorian, who wanted to raise his family the way animals live, free of the material world. (US, 2008, 93mins., R, Dir. Doug Pray)

MARCH 6 • FROZEN RIVER

Ray Eddy, an upstate New York trailer mom, is lured into the world of illegal immigrant smuggling when she meets a Mohawk girl who lives on a reservation that straddles the US-Canadian border. Broke after her husband takes off with the down payment for their new doublewide, Ray reluctantly teams up with Lila, a smuggler, and the two begin making runs across the frozen St. Lawrence River carrying illegal Chinese and Pakistani immigrants in the trunk of Ray's Dodge Spirit. (US, 2008, 97mins., R, Dir. Courtney Hunt) Filmed in Plattsburgh, NY. Director Courtney Hunt will be on-hand as the Guest Speaker if her schedule allows.

APRIL 24 • RELIGULOUS

Stand-up comedian Bill Maher travels to Israel, England, the Netherlands, Vatican City, and across America, speaking to people about faith and religion. This documentary uses humor--and lots of cynicism and sarcasm--to examine controversial theories and topics that people feel very strongly about, no matter what side of the fence they are on. Funny and offensive in equal measure, Religulous aims less to change hearts and minds than to inspire conversation. (US, 2008, 101mins., R, Dir. Larry Charles)
