Friday, June 24 • Tiny Furniture
(US, 2010, 98 mins, NR, Dir. Lena Dunham) Winner of the best narrative feature at the SXSW Film Festival, this is a hilarious and endearing film that explores the depths of romantic humiliation and the heights of post-college confusion. Writer/director/star Lena Dunham is being called one of the most exciting new voices in American independent cinema and critics are hailing her film as "irresistibly funny," "unnervingly honest," and "near perfection."

Friday, July 1 • L'Avventura Flashback Film!
(France/Italy, 1960, 143 mins, NR, Dir. Michelangelo Antonioni) Starting with the mysterious disappearance of a guest on a yachting trip, Antonioni's famous 1960 masterpiece becomes the subtle, unpredictable, and beautifully shot tale of a woman's adventure of self-discovery in the world of the idle rich. Regularly cited among the best films ever made, it made Monica Vitti a star.

Thursday, July 7 • Marwencol
(US, 2010, 83 mins, NR, Dir. Jeff Malmberg) When Mark Hogancamp emerged from a coma following a vicious attack, he had little memory of his past life. Seeking solace, he built an incredible 1/6th scale World War II-era town in his backyard. He populated the town with dolls and toy soldiers, and created life-like photographs detailing the town's many relationships and intrigues. When the photos are discovered by an art magazine, and a prestigious gallery comes calling, Mark is suddenly forced to make a choice between the safety of his fictional town and the real world beyond it.

Thursday, July 14 • Bag It
(US, 2010, 78 mins, NR, Dir. Suzan Beraza) Plastic is everywhere and infiltrates our lives in unimaginable and frightening ways. In this touching and often flat-out-funny documentary, we follow "everyman" Jeb Berrier, who is admittedly not a tree hugger, as he embarks on a global tour to unravel the complexities of our plastic world. What starts as a film about plastic bags evolves into an investigation into plastic and its effect on our waterways, oceans, and even our bodies.

Thursday, August 11 • Herb & Dorothy
(US, 2009, 89 mins, NR, Dir. Megumi Sasaki) Despite their modest means, Herbert and Dorothy Vogel are the most important contemporary art collectors you have never heard of. He is a postal clerk. She is a librarian. Their shared passion and discipline defied stereotypes and redefined what it means to be a patron of the arts. Over four decades, the Vogels amassed their collection of over 4,000 works, including ones by Sol LeWitt, Christo, Richard Tuttle, Chuck Close and Lawrence Weiner.

Thursday, August 18 • The Red Shoes Flashback Film!
Sponsored by Ursula Trudeau and presented as a tribute to long-time LPCA supporter MiLi Distin.
(US, 1948, 133 mins, NR, Dir. Michael Powell & Emeric Pressburger) Centered around a ballet performance of Hans Christian Andersen's dark fairy tale, a ballerina (Moira Shearer) is torn between her love for a ballet director (Anton Walbrook) and a composer (Marius Goring). Featuring impressive choreography by Robert Helpmann and performances by the Lermontov Ballet Company.

Thursday, August 25 • Handsome Harry
(US, 2010, 96 mins, R, Dir. Bette Gordon) An unexpected call from his past pulls Harry Sweeney out of his comfortable, small-town life. Reaching a former navy buddy on his deathbed, Harry promises to unravel the mystery of a long-buried crime... and to ask forgiveness from the victim. But to track down the rest of their group and reconstruct events from decades earlier, he must break the code of silence that's governed their lives.

Thursday, September 1 • Dave Brubeck: In His Own Sweet Way
(US, 2010, 85 mins, NR, Dir. Bruce Ricker) Still going strong at age 90, composer and pianist Dave Brubeck played more than 50 concerts around the world last year. Along with his original quartet he took jazz to a new place, experimenting with time signatures in "Take Five" and other pieces, and later expanding the repertoire to include orchestral works. It's all here in this warm personal documentary, including vintage performances, jam sessions, and interviews with musicians and Dave himself, along with his wife and collaborator Iola.

Friday, September 9 • Waiting for Superman
(US, 2010, 102 mins, PG, Dir. Davis Guggenheim) Education "statistics" have names: Anthony, Francisco, Bianca, Daisy, and Emily, their stories make up the engrossing foundation for this documentary. Following a handful of promising kids through a system that inhibits, rather than encourages, academic growth, Guggenheim undertakes an exhaustive review of public education, surveying "drop-out factories" and "academic sink-holes," methodically dissecting the system and its seemingly intractable problems.

If you are unable to use a ticket, a voucher for a future show in the same season, less a \$3/ticket handling charge, can be issued when the LPCA is notified 36 hours prior to the curtain time of the purchased ticket. For specific shows, discounts are offered to Senior Citizens 62 years and older, and students with valid ID. Discounts are available on group ticket sales of 20 or more. Toddlers up to 24 months do not need tickets if seated on your lap. All aisles must be kept clear - strollers & carriers must be left in the lobby. Wheelchair seating can be reserved.
