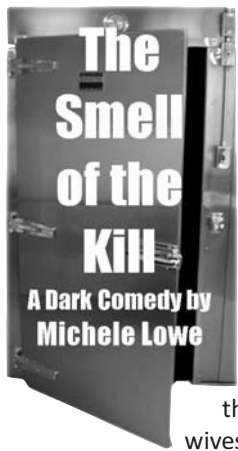

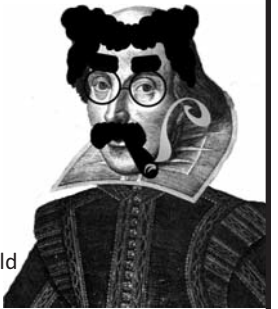

Set in post-WWII Germany, the film follows teenager Michael Berg as he engages in a passionate but secretive affair with an older woman. Eight years after her disappearance, he is stunned to discover her again as she stands on trial for Nazi war crimes. A haunting story about truth, reconciliation and how one generation comes to terms with the crimes of another. (2008, 123mins., R, Dir. Stephen Daldry)

FEBRUARY 19 • EVERY LITTLE STEP

For over three decades, there's been one singular sensation: A Chorus Line, the groundbreaking hit musical inspired by the emotional lives of dancers during the audition process. MARCH 5 • Love In The Time of Cholera

Based on the bestselling novel by Nobel Prize winning author, Gabriel Garcia Marquez, this epic love story spans a lifetime, set against the breathtaking backdrop of South America during the turn of the century. When a teenage Florentino Ariza sees Fermina Daza for the first time, a spark of youthful infatuation ignites a romance that will carry the two from intoxicating highs to desperate lows over the next 50 years. MARCH 12 • THE COVE

In a sleepy lagoon off the coast of Japan, behind a wall of barbed wire and "Keep Out" signs, lies a shocking secret. Under cover of night, fishermen engage in a hunt for thousands of dolphins. The nature of the work is so horrifying, a few desperate men will stop at nothing to keep it hidden from the world. When an elite team of activists, filmmakers & free-divers embark on a covert mission to penetrate the cove, they discover shocking atrocities are just the tip of the iceberg. MARCH 26 • 500 DAYS OF SUMMER

In this quirky romantic comedy about love and fate, a young greeting card writer is hopelessly, helplessly searching for the girl of his dreams...and his new co-worker, Summer, may just be "the one." But the 500 days of their offbeat relationship reveal (in no particular order) that the road to happiness can be unpredictable, uncontrollable—and unbelievably funny! (US, 2009, 95mins., PG-13, Dir. APRIL 23 • SHINE A LIGHT

Academy Award-winning filmmaker Martin Scorsese and the world's greatest Rock'N' Roll band, The Rolling Stones, unite to bring audiences the year's most extraordinary film event, Shine A Light. MAY 7 • BRIGHT STAR

From Jane Campion, Academy Award winner of The Piano, comes a sweeping love story that will carry you back through time to experience the passion and romance between acclaimed poet, John Keats and his beloved muse. London 1818: a secret love affair begins between 23 year old English poet, John Keats, and the girl next door Fanny Brawne, an outspoken student of high fashion. This unlikely pair began at odds, he thinking her a stylish minx, while she was unimpressed not only by his poetry but also by literature in general. (2009, 119mins., PG, Dir. Jane Campion)
