-  Poets must be enrolled in Grades 1-12 (including public, private, or home schooling).
-  All poems must be original. Please no obscenities.
-  Entries are limited to two poems per student.
-  Poems may be of any length and in any form of verse (rhyme, meter, free, blank, etc).
